## Guidelines For A Rescue

1. Remain Calm. Stop all work and assess the situation first. **DO NOT BECOME A SECOND VICTIM**
2. Call EMS Services (911) as soon as possible so they are on site when the employee arrives at ground level.
3. While talking to EMS give them a description of what is happening on site and take any advice they may give.
4. The rescuer shall assess the medical condition of the victim before the rescue starts.
5. The rescuer shall inform the ground members what medical treatment & equipment will be needed.
6. If existing rigging is used in the rescue, check anchor points to ensure proper connection.
7. The site / work area shall be secured to prevent further hazards and/or injury to other personnel.
8. If a load is suspended, it shall be lowered or secured before the rescue starts.
9. Safely lower the victim to the ground. Lower at a consistent rate. Do not bounce or jerk. Be aware of the victims back and neck. Be aware of appurtenances on the tower on the way down.
10. Lay the victim gently on the ground. Be aware of the back and neck areas.
11. Remain Calm..... assist the victim!
12. Call your office as soon as possible and fill out an accident report when feasible.
13. Report to OSHA.
14. Secure area for investigation.
15. Document everything for the home office.
